### Greetings Casparados!

When I think back on this year **I am filled with gratitude to all of you who make our community so strong, resilient, and fun!** You may have set up a monthly pledge, or thought to send a check for the times you've used the EV charging station, or you've been able to be so generous you have funded entire projects. Some of you are servers at every **4th Sunday Breakfast** or dishwashers at every **Pub Night**, or you've created an event or class we get to enjoy together. So many of you come to our community events, helping out, bringing friends, slipping a few extra dollars in the tip jars – keeping us going, together. **Every day I am grateful to live in our small town** (*where I was born!*), working and playing with our remarkable Caspar Community.

As we began to plan our annual **New Year's Eve Dance Party** (*see over*) we realized this will be **the twentieth year we have begun on the dance floor together**. Twenty years ago the first party was held in the old Company Store, to celebrate the new millennium. I was away from home in 1999 but I know that quite a few of you who were here will be dancing with us this year to the uplifting music of **Mama Grows Funk**.

Our **Caspar Community Emergency Preparedness Project** has been getting stronger, joined by other coastal communities inspired by our group's work to make plans to help us all through potential disasters. Several neighborhoods and groups from Caspar and other parts of the Coast have gathered to plan together in meetings and workshops at our Center and in many other places nearby. I was told recently that if a tsunami ever comes our way, *Comptche is ready to shelter us*. **What we do here spreads out into our wider community** – and comes back to benefit us even more!

When the electricity was shut off in October, I was here at the Center with the band, setting up for our Pop-up Dance Party. The lights came back on so fast band members didn't believe me when I said that we had just switched from PG&E to our own power. Living in downtown Caspar, it was such a comfort to see our events continue without interruption and the Center ready as needed (the landline works and I check in every day). There are many heroes amongst us to be thanked for that, those who set up and who maintain our back-up system to be almost as strong as our everyday system.

Our biggest project in the past year, made possible by your donations and volunteer time, has been to restore our garage. We will be able to use it for secure storage for equipment we use for events, rentals, and even food for emergency use. We now have a freeze dryer which preserves fresh food for up to 20 years. As we organize our garage, we'll be able to make our green room more attractive and comfortable. In 2020 we will be refinishing our floors, painting the building, and, as always, keeping the Center well-stocked and equipped for its many uses.
