Greetings Casparados!

We've completed many projects this year thanks to your donations and more are on the way.

You may have noticed new gravel on the southern parking area. This project was much larger that it appears. We've had a recurrent problem with a seasonal spring that erodes the parking area every winter leaving large mud filled pot holes. Big River Rock excavated the area and installed a layer of drain rock covered by a membrane and finished the top layer with rolled paving gravel. This will leach the seasonal spring away from the parking area and solve our recurring pot hole problems.

Superior Pump with help from NCR&E re-activated the old unused schoolhouse well. They trenched and provided separate pressure and draft lines to the north and south sides of the building complete with fire hose boxes for use by our community first responders and draft connections for use by fire trucks. Valves were installed to allow the Community Center to operate in the event of a distribution failure by our water provider.

Smaller projects included replacing dinner and glassware and adding a washer/dryer for kitchen towels and linens.

Soon to come is an electric vehicle charging station. This is being facilitated by the Mendocino Land Trust.

None of these projects would have been possible without your tireless volunteer efforts and your financial contributions. There are still major projects that we need to accomplish in 2018. Please consider a donation to the Caspar Community in your year end financial planning.

In 2018 we need to rebuild the barn. This is the last structural challenge at the Community Center. The barn is our only storage facility and is well beyond its useful life. We need to pour a slab and foundation, replace doors, make other repairs and provide electric service. This is a big project and we need your year end contributions. We have been offered \$15K in matching funds towards this \$30K project. The result will be a weatherproof, rodentproof, lockable structure housing our disaster supplies and less frequently needed Community Center supplies and equipment.

Finally, there is a need to provide an emergency satellite telephone for community use in case of fire, earthquake or other disaster. If you want to call your loved ones when the bridges collapse and the phones and power fail, please consider increasing your monthly pledge to help cover the \$60 monthly satellite phone bill.
